### Open data

Data: all information, regardless of form (databases, text, pictures, film)

Open: may be used by all, for all purposes, edited and re-shared, without additional permission (but under certain terms)

**NBIC** shares data openly



## Why open data

Our mandate: to provide society with knowledge on biodiversity in Norway

Law and guidelines: freedom of information, EU directive on re-use of public sector information → Public funds use must be transparent and benefit society

**Effective**: Good, understandable agreements save resources and misunderstandings.

→ Improves international cooperation.



### **About licenses**

**Default situation**: copyright owner decides on usage and terms on individual basis

License: copyright owner gives general permission to all that meet certain terms

- Well-defined, known rules: clear and robust
- Owner stays owner: sharing is not "giving away"
- Can not be withdrawn
- NB: violation is infringement!



### Our default license

Creative commons: organization publishing several licenses, Internationally valid and known



CC BY 4.0 (attribution)

- Owner must be credited, license specified
- «As is»: no liability, no approval



Default license in NBIC




### Multimedia

CC BY 4.0: preferred

CC BY-SA 4.0 (attribution, share alike)

 Derived works must be licensed under the same license

## Open data in practice

Licensing is now an integral part of our funding calls

#### **Exceptions**

- Data about persons
- Sensitive species (we regulate access)
- Trademarks

**Recommendation**: establish and implement an open data licensing policy, saves a lot of trouble and enhances cooperation and visibility (see <u>our policy</u>)
